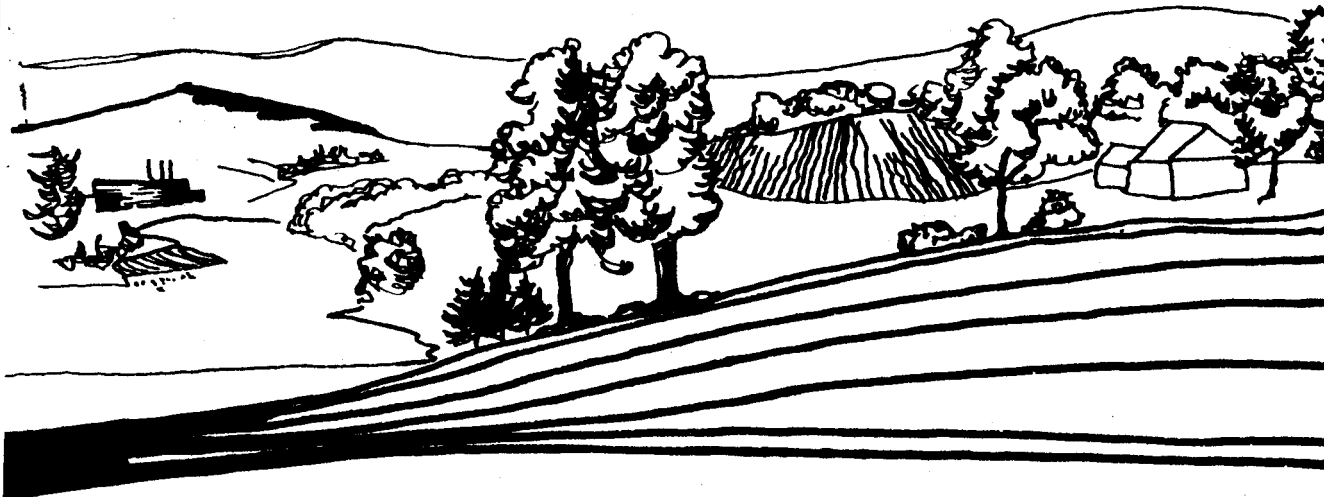

IN MEMORIAM

JACK WILLARD SNYDER
March 12, 1928 — April 30, 1980

It is with deep regret that we report the death of a long-time member of AMCBT, Jack Snyder. Jack was elected as a Member-at-Large to the Steering Committee last year in Louisville, and had been a member of AMCBT since 1971. Jack was a Professor at Eureka College, where he had been a member of the faculty since 1965. He died while visiting in Ferrum, Virginia. He is survived by his wife, three daughters and four sons. All of us in AMCBT extend our deepest sympathy to his family. We will sorely miss his active, vigorous participation in AMCBT.

As if the above were not enough, this mailing of the program for the 24th Annual Meeting was delayed because of the death of two more AMCBT members, both at the same school, Iowa Central Community College. James Royce, of ICCC, and our program chairman informed that the delay in assembling the program was caused in part by the death of both W. G. Bennett, who was made an Honorary Life Member last year, and C. L. Christensen, both of ICCC. Details are not yet available to Bioscene, and will be run in the next issue. Again our deepest sympathy to the families of both AMCBT members.

Friday Morning Field Trips

Rock Springs Environmental Center. This is an area of about 1,092 acres, that is owned and operated by the Macon County Conservation District. It includes a number of different ecosystems, prairie, marsh, woodlands. It is about 5 miles from Millikin. Some additional cars will be needed for transportation.

Clinton Lake. This is a new lake developed as a cooling lake for the Illinois Power Companies Nuclear plant. Jim Smithson, former member of AMCBT, is in charge of the biological aspects of the lake and will give AMCBT a tour of facilities and the lake. It is about 25 miles from Decatur. Some cars will be needed for additional transportation.

Archer Daniel Midland's (ADM) Gasohol Plant. This is one of the few plants in the U.S. currently producing gasohol. It is in Decatur, about 5 miles from Millikin. Some cars will be needed.

A. E. Staley Labs. A. E. Staley Company of Decatur, is a food processing company, with their main laboratory in Decatur. They are located approximately 3 miles from Millikin. Some cars will be needed for additional transportation.

Airlines The only airline which services Decatur is Ozark. If you are flying in, please note this on your meal reservation. Our local arrangements chairman, Norm Jensen, will attempt to arrange for some type of transportation. We will get back to you on this.

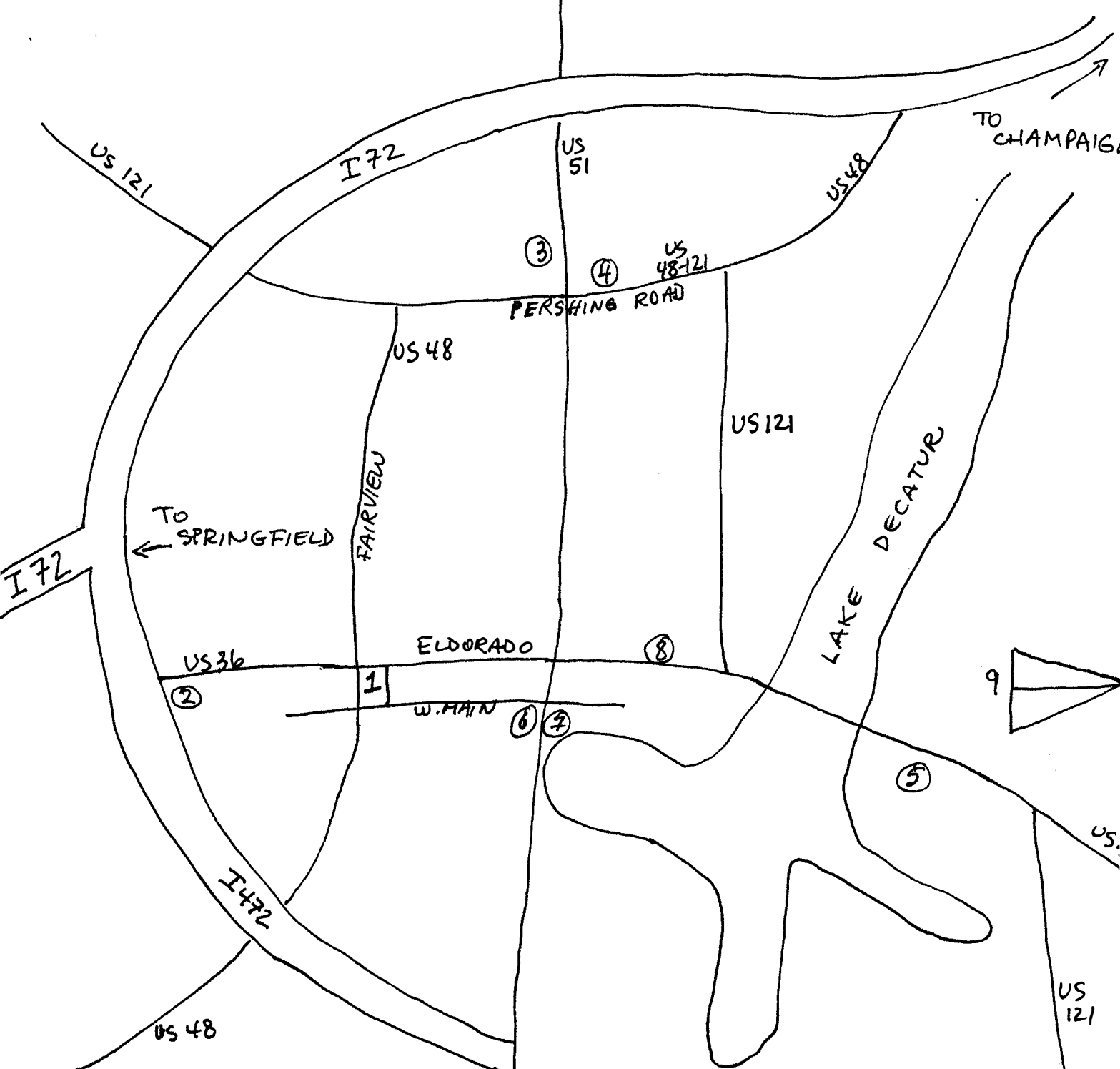
